Measures 2-3: Soprano Recorder, Alto Recorder, Tenor Recorder, Bass Clarinet, Soprano Sax, Alto Sax, Tenor Sax play sustained notes at dynamic **pp**. Measures 4-5: Euphonium, Tuba play sustained notes at dynamic **pp**. Measures 6-7: Violin I, Violin II, Viola play sixteenth-note patterns at dynamic **p**, then eighth-note patterns at dynamic **mf**. Measures 8-9: Cello, Contrabass play sustained notes at dynamic **p**, then eighth-note patterns at dynamic **pp**. Measure 10: Escaleta plays sustained notes at dynamic **pp**.
